How to download and use the app:

All you need to do is:

- Download the app from Google Play or Apple App stores
- Enter your details once when you first open the app
- Open the app when you next visit a venue
- Select 'Check in Now' and scan or enter the code



Using this digital check in means your details will be stored securely by the Queensland Government for 56 days to assist with COVID-19 contact tracing (if needed).

5. Cattleya - exhibition type less than 70mm (see schedule definition)
6. Cattleya cluster - including exhibition and non-exhibition type
7. Phalaenathe Dendrobium - Red/Purple
8. Phalaenathe Dendrobium - any other colour
9. Dendrobium - including intermediate, spatulata, and latouria types
10. Vanda - 60mm and over
11. Vanda - less than 60mm
12. Vandaceous - intergeneric

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. Entries are free and open to all financial members of Noosa District Orchid & Foliage Society.
2. No plant or plants may be removed from the Show until the official termination of the Show without permission of the Show Marshalls.
3. Plants not in Show Bench condition, diseased or pest infected, are not eligible as decided by the Show Marshalls.
4. All plants to be clearly labelled. (Owner's identification and Society on reverse and plant name on the front). All exhibitors are responsible to see that all plants are correctly labelled.
5. All plants must have been owned by the exhibitor for a minimum of six (6) months prior to the commencement of the Show.
6. The NDOFS Inc. accepts NO responsibility for theft, loss, destruction, or damage occasioned to plants at the Show or on the sales tables. However, all care will be taken to avoid the above happening.
7. A pollinated or dead/dying or missing flower or flowers on a plant or inflorescence shall not disqualify that plant or inflorescence but shall detract from the merit of the exhibit.
8. A MINIMUM of two thirds of buds on an inflorescence must be fully opened before it is eligible to be judged unless it is the natural habit of the species to flower progressively.
9. All prize winners will be eligible for judging in selection of the Champion Orchid. After selection of Champion, the second Prize Winner in the Champions Class will be eligible for selection of reserve Champion along with other first prize winners from other classes.
10. Staking and tying to support the inflorescence will be permitted. The Judging Panel has the right to remove all staking and/or tying if necessary, to ascertain the strength of the flower spike. On all inflorescences no staking or ties are allowed on or above the pedicel or ovary of the flower. All ties must be such that they can be removed easily at the request of the Judging Panel and must allow any missing flowers to be seen clearly.
11. If there are less than three eligible entries in the class, the Show Marshalls will be consulted as to whether that class be judged, or the plants included in another appropriate class.
12. If after judging, a flower does not hold up to the expectations of its Class, it is the right of the Show Marshalls to remove the plant from the bench.
13. The Show Marshalls have the authority to remove any plant or plants from the sales table area if deemed unfit for sale.

SCHEDULE DEFINITIONS

Alliance

Genera of orchids which interbreed with one another either in pairs or multiple combinations.

Exhibition Type

Indicates flower characteristics that are to be generally described as in the 'A.O.C. Standards for Judging'.

Novelty Cattleya

An intra or intergeneric alliance may be multi flowered and may be brightly coloured with no particular emphasis on shape but with emphasis on spots.

Miniature Cattleya

An intra or intergeneric Cattleya alliance hybrid possessing exhibition characteristics but miniature in flower size and growth habit. Flower size shall be less than 70mm.

Intermediate Type Dendrobium

Hard cane Dendrobiums having petals which are generally elongated, and which may or may not be twisted.

Australian Native Species

Includes all species indigenous to the Australian politically controlled States and Islands but excludes natural hybrids as per 'A.O.C. Standards for Judging'.

Australian Native Hybrids

Resultant progeny cross or crosses having only Australian native species in its ancestry.

Inflorescence

A single flower stem with its flowers and buds.
