






## Plant of the month: Maxillaria tenuifolia

This orchid typically grows in the Mexico - Nicaragua area and is known as the coconut orchid, for when in flower its coconut perfume fills the air.

I have had this very hardy plant for many years and have divided it several times. It is watered and fed along with all my other orchids and does not seem to be susceptible to pest or fungal attack. It's grown in small bark with perlite and charcoal added.

At present, it is growing under trees which provide dappled light in the morning, but it is exposed to the western sun in the afternoon, which it seems to tolerate.
