### New phalaenopsis growing tips >

Dave Lyons shared these tips he recently picked up from phalaenopsis 'guru' Gordon Grant of the Aspley Orchid Society.

Dave reports that Gordon now uses sphagnum moss for potting phalaenopsis.

"He is a guru when it comes to growing and presenting phalaenopsis at meetings and shows," says Dave.

"He advises that using sphagnum moss will encourage roots to grow and will be easily seen if they are in clear pots. Like most other orchids over-watering will kill the roots. If the roots are grey, then water, if green don't water,"
